Year 3 Romans Workshop we have organised 'Portals to the Past' to come into school to deliver a Romans Workshop for the children in Year 3. The visit will take place on Thursday 16th March 2023. During the all-day visit, the children will have the opportunity to take part in a variety of exciting and interactive activities. Year 1 Warwick Castle Trip to support our theme work for this term, we would like to take the children in Year 1 for a visit to Warwick Castle on Wednesday 15th March 2023. As this is a whole day trip the kitchen will provide packed lunches for all of the children who normally have a school dinner. For those children who normally bring in a packed lunch please ensure your child's lunch is in a disposable bag and does not contain any glass bottles. In case of rain the children should bring a suitable coat to wear. During the visit photographs/videos may be taken of the children working on various activities. We will use photographs in line with the photo consent form that you have completed previously. We would like to ask for a contribution of £16.00 from each child to cover the cost of the transport and a 'Castle Life Tour' Can we please ask that payment of £16.00 is made via Pay360 by Wednesday 1st March 2023.

Year 5 The National Space Centre Trip This term, the children have begun learning all about the exciting topic of Space! To help bring this topic to life, we would like to take them to visit The National Space Centre, which will include a Planetarium Show taking them on a 'Journey Through the Solar System'. This trip will take place on Wednesday 22nd March 2023, and we are asking for a contribution of £17.00 to cover the cost of transport and entrance to the museum. As this is a whole day event, all children will need to bring a packed lunch. If your child is entitled to a free school meal, a packed lunch will be provided. There is a gift shop at the centre and if your child would like to bring some money to spend (no more than £5) please put it in a named envelope on the day. During the visit photos/video may be taken of the students working on various activities. We will use photographs in line with the photo consent form that you have completed previously.
