

This week in Year 2 science we recapped what we learnt in year one and identified everyday materials. We had a walk around and outside of the classroom to look at whether objects were manufactured or made from natural resources.





Year 4 spent a lovely, sunny afternoon in the woods creating art work around our school values based on The Dot. Working in teams, we used natural resources from the woods to create our designs.

Year 6 have been learning about living things. They understood that

the method of arranging the organisms into groups is called classification. They explored deeper in the school woods to see what lived in that habitat. They observed each one to see their characteristics closely.
