Reception Trip to Children's Play Village, Monday 13th November to support imaginative play and support understanding of people and communities, which is linked to a wide range of EYFS objectives, Reception will be visiting the Children's Play Village in Warwick. The children will be attending the afternoon session and will return to school by the end of the school day, they will have their lunch before they leave at 11.45p.m. We are asking for a contribution of £16.00 per child to cover the cost of transport and entry into the Play Village. You can make payment and give consent via the 'My Child At School' app. The deadline to do so is Monday 6th November 2023. If your child is entitled to the Pupil Premium Grant, the school will fund the cost of the trip. Please ensure that your child comes into school wearing full school uniform. We will be leaving the Play Village at approximately 2.55p.m. so will be back at school slightly later than the normal pick-up time of 3.20p.m. we should arrive back by 3.30p.m. however if there are any delays a message will be sent to you via the 'My Child At School' app. If you have any questions, please speak to your child's teacher.





Celebrating our week



Year 5 enjoyed our trip to Coventry Cathedral. we sketched different parts of the cathedral's architecture and learnt a bit more about the history of Coventry during the war.





As part of their science lesson, Year 4 investigated different ways to absorb sound. They used a range of materials to decide which would work best when sound proofing a bird box.
