Following our inspection on the 19th and 20th September 2022, it is an absolute pleasure to share our OFSTED report with you, which is on our school website. We are very pleased that the inspector found Allesley to be:

A school that lives its values on a daily basis: honesty, respect, perseverance, positivity, independence and compassion. Staff aspire to ensure that 'Every child that touches Allesley takes away a wonderful experience'. They achieve this aim in this warm, inclusive and welcoming school. (Ofsted 2023)

We believe the report reflects our school community well, our children, staff, governors, and parents who work tirelessly to ensure as well as providing a great education we prepare our children in all areas for life in the world around us.

During the two-day inspection, the senior leadership team, curriculum leaders and governors received more detailed feedback from the Ofsted team (beyond the report). They confirmed the judgements that we had already made about our school, and it was agreed that the leaders know the school well.

We are incredibly proud of our school and all the people associated with it and we are all determined to continue keep making improvements.

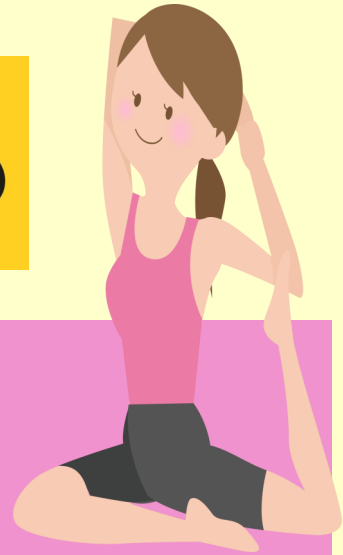

Happy Birthday





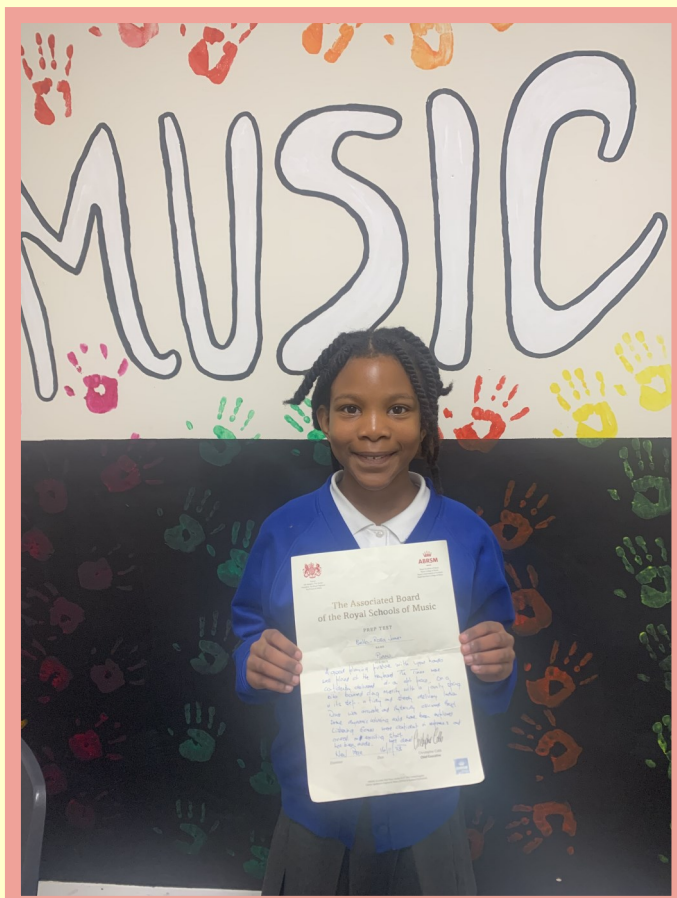

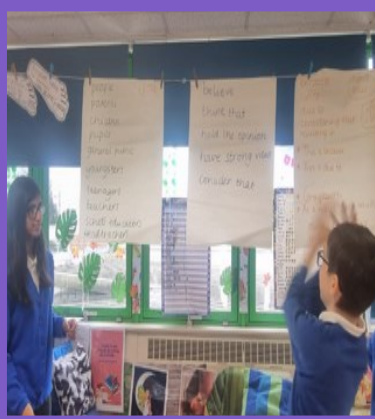
This week in Science, Year 5 have reported back on Jane Goodall and her work with chimpanzees in Tanzania.



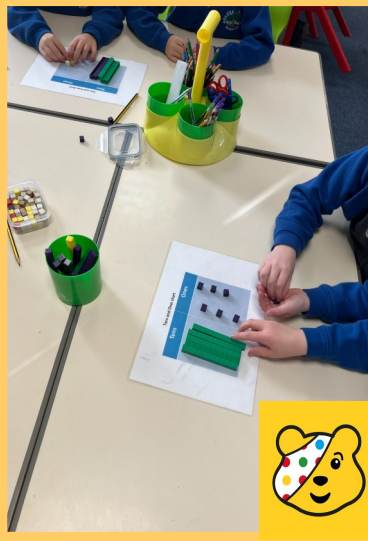
Year 1 heard the story of Diwali and learnt how children around the world celebrate the festival of light.



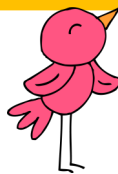
This week, Year 3 enjoyed a nature inspired yoga session. They made different positions to represent how the leaves would fall from trees.
