Dol-y-Moch - Year 6 Residential Trip_This Academic School Year our Dol-y-Moch visit for the children in Year 6 will be taking place from Monday 19th February 2024 to Friday 23rd February 2024. This is a unique opportunity for your child to take part in many outdoor adventures such as kayaking, climbing, abseiling, mountaineering and orienteering as well as learning about the natural environment in the heart of Snowdonia's National Park. The cost of the visit is subsidised, with school covering half the cost of the visit. This year the cost to parents for the trip will be £180.00.
