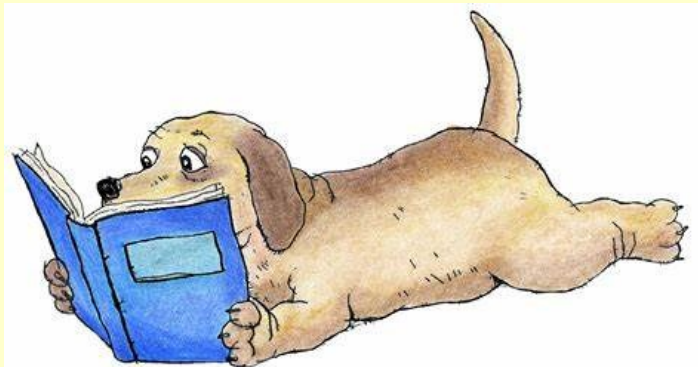
Year 3 - Romans Workshop, Tuesday 20th February 2024. Cost: £7.50, payment deadline Monday 5th February 2024

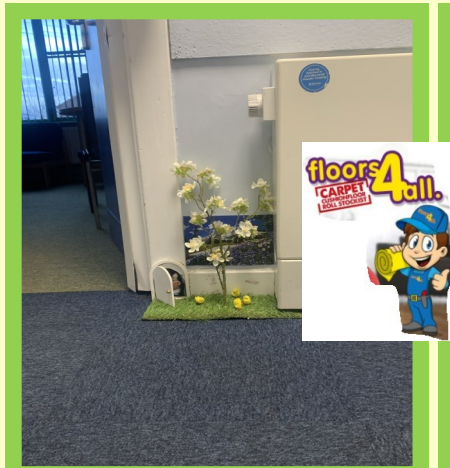

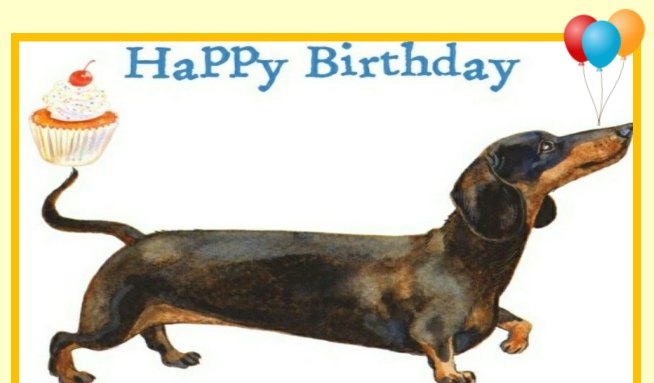

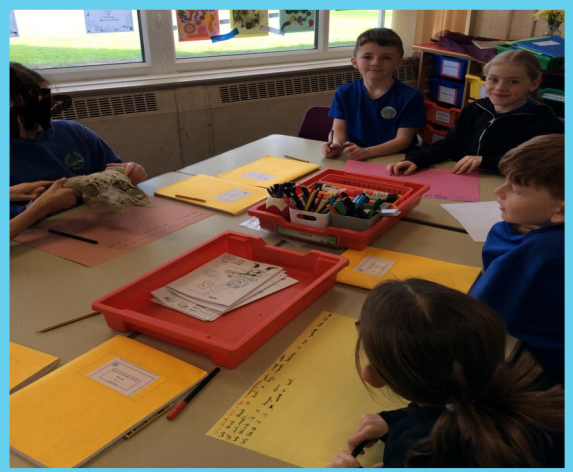




Celebrating our week



This week in **Reception** we have made and decorated Gingerbread people to go with our learning about traditional tales. We measured and weighed the ingredients, rolled out the dough, and used the cutter to make the shape. We were lucky that our gingerbread people didn't run away!



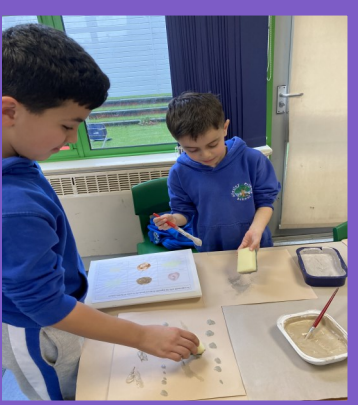
Year 4 became detectives during English, after their classroom was ransacked by a mysterious monster. They investigated items of evidence from the crime scene and used expanded noun phrases to best describe each item.



Year 6 This week in Geography we have been looking at the different mountain ranges in the United Kingdom. We used an atlas to help us identify higher ground. We also created our own contour model which uses lines to show how steep a mountain is.



Year 1 enjoyed a great tennis lesson with a coach this week.



As artists, **Year 3** have enjoyed exploring prehistoric art. They have experimented with pigments in natural products to make a prehistoric paint pallet.



In **Year 5** science, we have been studying forces and created boats to sail across the water. We timed them and noted the water resistance.
