

Year 6 have produced some wonderfully original stories based on the story Flotsam. They shared their stories with Year 5 and now they look absolutely fantastic on display.




Year 2 have had so much fun retelling a familiar using story language. We can't wait to invent and write our own stories next week using all the grammar we have practised this week!
