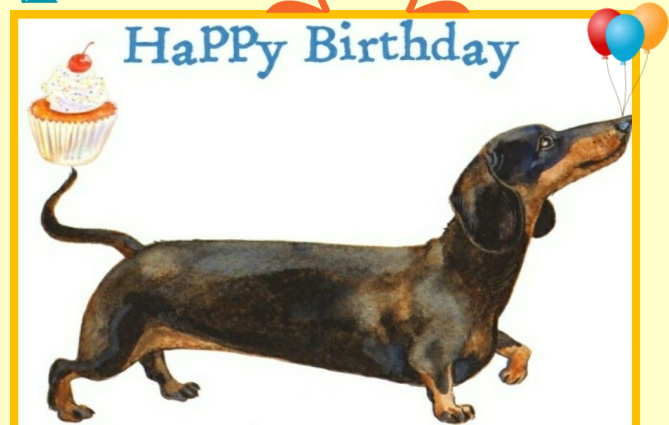

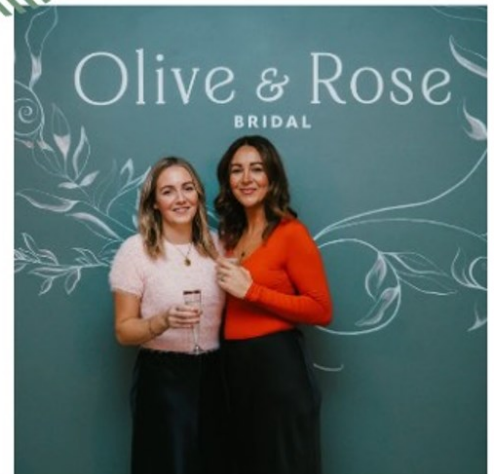


# Are you getting married?

In Nursery we are learning about Chinese New Year, we read the story about the animal's race then acted it out ourselves. The rat came first but he was a bit of a cheat!



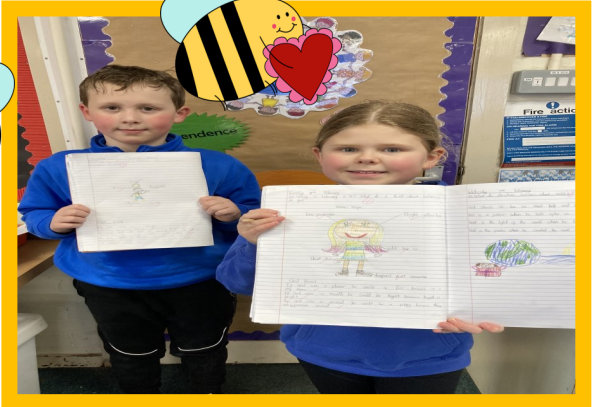
Year 1 spent the afternoon learning about Chinese new year and designing their own lanterns.
