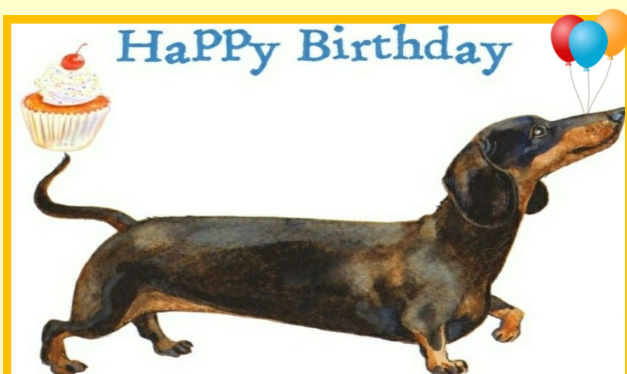

In our **year 5** English lesson we pretended to be newspaper reporters in 1969 and interviewed each other about the Saturn 5 rocket launch and the first man on the moon.



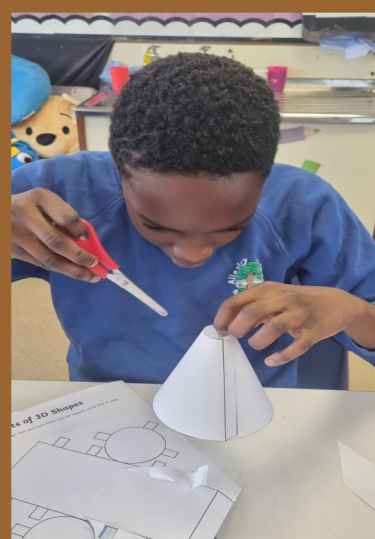
Year 2 have been learning about measuring in centimetres and metres. We had a lot of fun measuring objects and even measuring the classroom and the playground.
