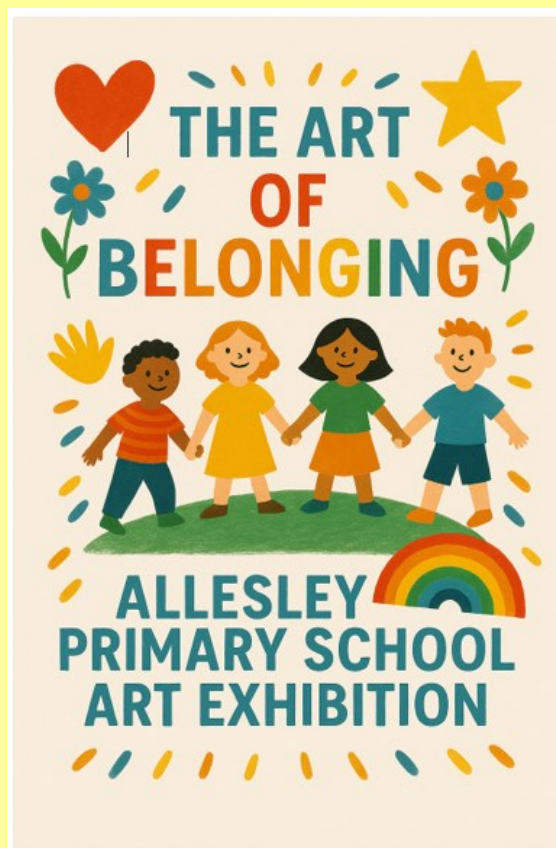

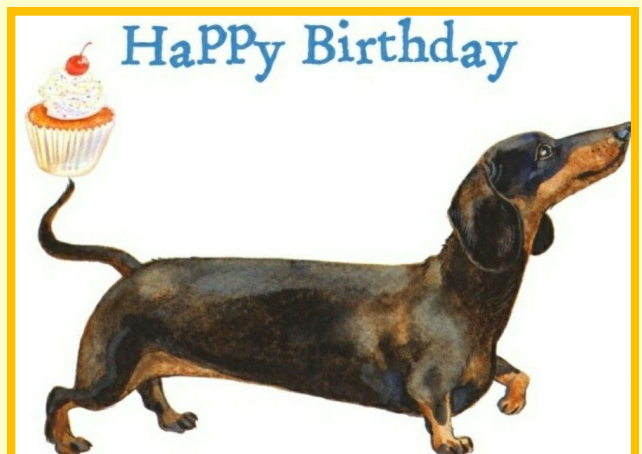

celebrating our week



Today, we became Viking market traders in Danelaw. In our Viking town of Allesley, we hosted a local market where our **Year 4** Viking farmers and craftsmen sold their masterpieces and goods to make some money. As local trades people, we also made our own expensive, precious jewellery, which highlights our position of wealth in the Viking community.



In Music this week, **Year 5** have been learning to play blues music. What musical children!



This week in **Reception** we have learnt about planting and how things grow, we used our fine motor and creative skills to draw our own plants and flowers.



In **Year 3** this week, we have completed our castle constructions. We used a mixture of nets and recyclable materials. It was such a challenge but we didn't give up.



This week, **Year 1** have been investigating how the stem of a flower works. We dyed the water and watched our petals change colour.



Year 2 this week in Science we planted our own sun flower seeds. We can not wait to watch them grow.



During the PSHE session, **Year 6** have been discussing the meaning of 'risk'. They found that taking a risk is an action which may have negative consequences but also some possible benefits. They weighed out the pros and cons of various scenarios to determine whether they were of a low, medium or a high risk.



The children in **Nursery** enjoyed re telling the story of The Very Hungry Caterpillar. They were very good at remembering all the different things that he ate!
