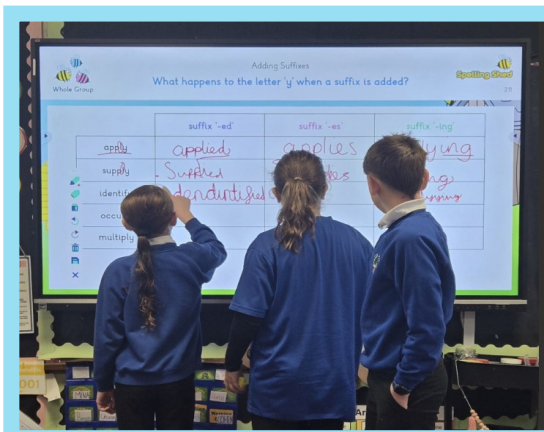
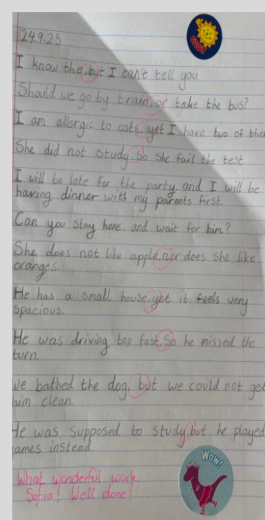


celebrating our week

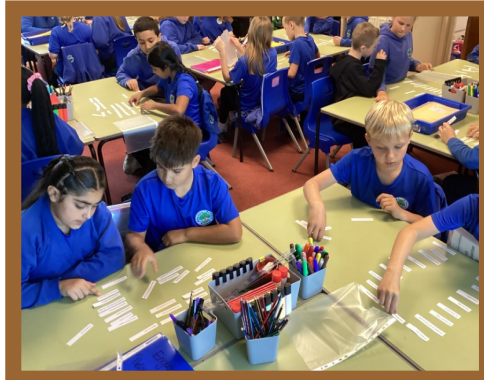
Year 6 have been working hard using spelling shed. This week they looked at how the root word changes when different suffixes are added.
