



### Celebrating our week



In Science, year 5 are using asexual reproduction to grow new plants from leaves, stems or tubers of parent plants. We will be caring for them over the next few weeks and recording their growth.



Year 6 have been delving into the fascinating life of Alexander the Great as part of their history I earning. As well as studying the key events and achievements of his life, pupils had the exciting opportunity to act out significant moments, bringing history to life through drama and creative interpretation.


In Music this week, **Year 4** learnt about body percussion. They performed a piece of music and worked together with one of them taking the lead role.

This week the **Reception** children have been focusing on the story pumpkin soup, taking part in various pumpkin related activities. They have been writing some letter sounds for the characters and items within the story.
