



Celebrating our week



In Year 3, we have been making a lot of noise, creating sound loops on scratch. We are developing our programming skills.



There was an air raid in year 5 this week! We heard the sirens and had to find shelter quickly whilst we heard bombing and loud explosions from outside. When we came out of the shelter, we talked about how it felt.

This week in science, Year 4 made musical instruments that created sound and could change pitch. We used various materials including elastic bands, which we tightened and loosened to change the pitch and pasta and rice so we could hear different sounds.

The **Reception** children have learning about the festival Diwali, and learning about how the festival of light started and created our own Diya lamps, we incorporated Diwali into our music and p.e lessons by doing various dances and games.
