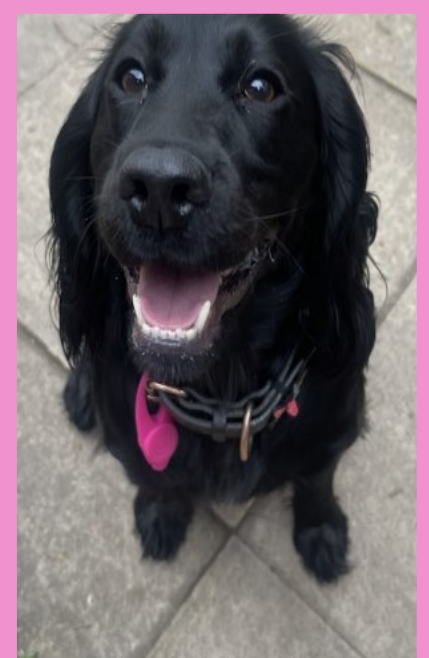

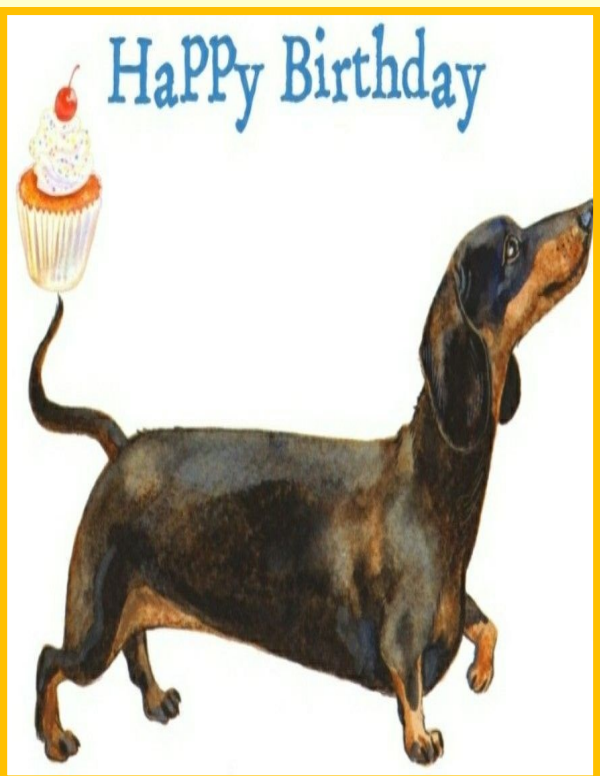

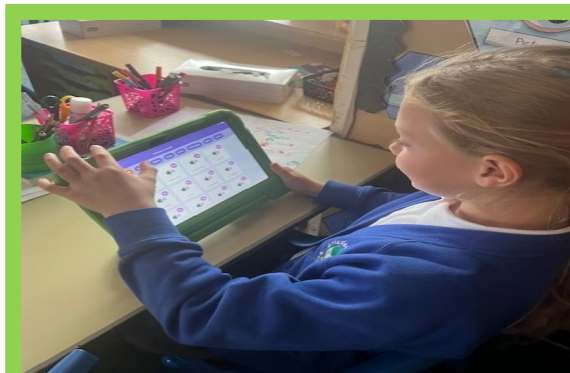

celebrating our week



In **Year 3**, we have been making a lot of noise, creating sound loops on scratch. We are developing our programming skills.



There was an air raid in **year 5** this week! We heard the sirens and had to find shelter quickly whilst we heard bombing and loud explosions from outside. When we came out of the shelter, we talked about how it felt.



Year 6 have made some excellent box sculptures based upon the work of Loise Nevelson. They are boxes to represent memories or reflect their personalities and loves. We have some amazing artists this year!



This week in **Year 2** the children had fun predicting and testing to see if different items sink or float.



In **Nursery** we used the conkers we had found to create a conker roll, we then measured with feet how far the conkers had rolled. We did some great counting.



This week in science, **Year 4** made musical instruments that created sound and could change pitch. We used various materials including elastic bands, which we tightened and loosened to change the pitch and pasta and rice so we could hear different sounds.



Year 1 had fun printing using different objects and paint to make Autumn pictures.



The **Reception** children have learning about the festival Diwali, and learning about how the festival of light started and created our own Diya lamps, we incorporated Diwali into our music and p.e lessons by doing various dances and games.
