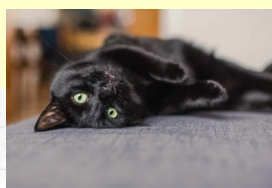

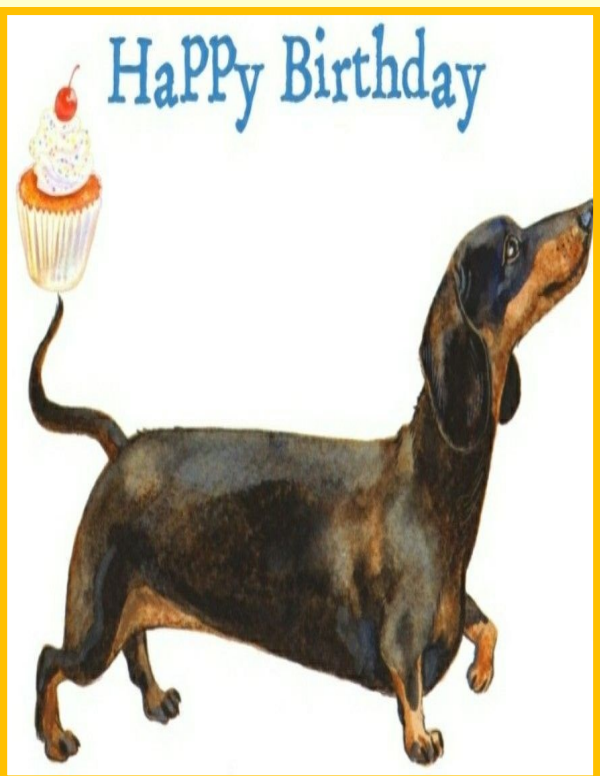

The **Reception** children have been focusing on all things autumn this week. They enjoyed making their own Hedgehog creations using the leaves we collected from the woods using brown, red, yellow and orange leaves.
