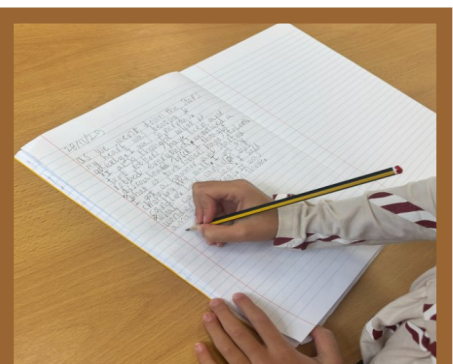
Year 1 enjoyed looking at and discussing toys from the past and modern toys. They were amazing at sorting them!

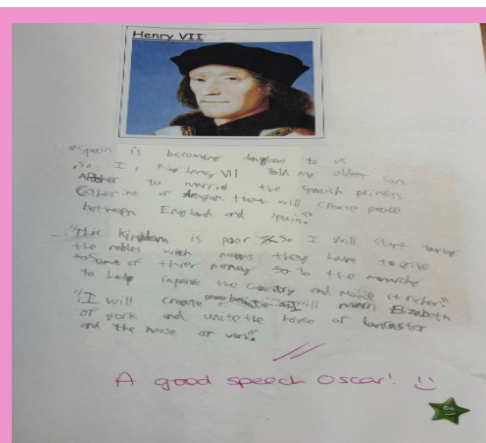

They completed a 'safe circle' grid, prioritising who they would speak to first in different situations. We also discussed why some people are more appropriate to talk to than others, depending on the nature of the worry.
