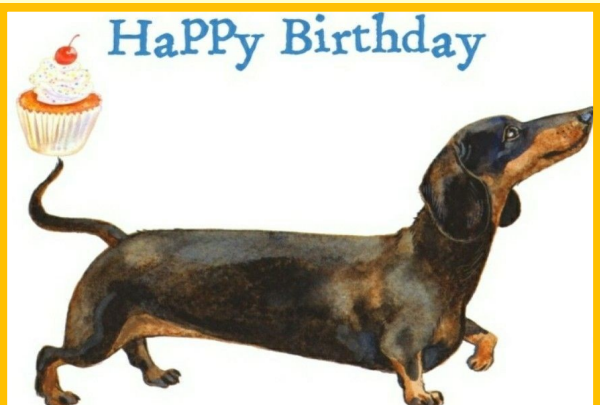

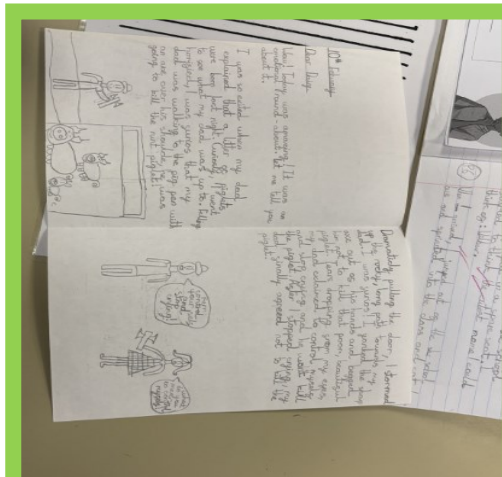

Year 6 spent part of Monday afternoon sharing their **Flotsam** stories with year 5. They were enjoyed by all- well done Year 6!



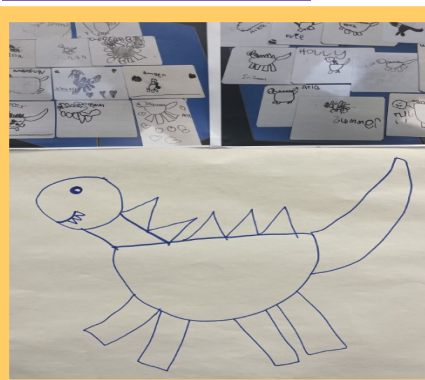
