

# Celebrating our week




In Nursery we have read *We're going on a Bear Hunt*, we re-told the story in the hall in a lovely physical way and had lots of fun.



In our next unit of PE we are studying dance in **Year 5**. We started by copying some bangra dancing. Look out for future Bollywood stars!



We celebrated Pancake day in **Reception**, talking about what pancake day is and how to make them. We created our own choosing which yummy toppings we wanted on them.



**Year 6** have been learning about values and traditions during their PSHE session. They explored the different values people hold in various parts of the world and considered how these can shape beliefs and behaviours. Through discussion of different scenarios, the children reflected on what might be seen as respectful or disrespectful and explained their reasoning.


This week, **Year 2** used their knowledge of different world habitats to consider why different animals are suited to where they live. Our classes knew a lot of interesting facts about a range of animals!
