

Starting our design and technology unit, **Year 5** are designing pop up books for younger children. We chose from a selection of nursery rhymes and began to plan out the pages.



In **Year 1** we have been making Windmills. We decided they needed to be able to stand up, they need a part to be able to catch the wind and move in the wind.




This week, **Year 2** enjoyed a fantastic cricket taster session. They learnt a range of new skills and practised their batting and throwing. There may be some future cricket stars in the making!



Year 6 have been exploring the area of shapes in maths this week. They have encountered a range of challenges and have been working hard to make accurate measurements when calculating the area of different shapes. During their learning, the children have also been studying different types of angles, including reflex angles, straight-line angles and right angles. In addition, they have explored shapes that contain perpendicular lines, helping them to further develop their understanding when measuring and analysing shapes. It has been great to see the year group applying their knowledge and problem-solving skills while tackling increasingly complex shapes.

This week in **Year 3** Art, we have been recreating Prehistoric Artwork using natural materials to replicate stone walls and Stone Age paintings.



The **Reception** children have been learning about Mothers day and the signs of spring this week, the children enjoyed manipulated the playdough in various shapes, e.g. hearts and flowers.



The **Nursery** children have had fun making perfumes and potions using flower petals and pipettes.



In our History lessons in **Year 4** we have been learning about causes and consequences of the Viking raid of Lindisfarne, we re-enacted the event to show the invasion of the monastery by the Vikings
