



# Celebrating our week




After looking at NASA's spacesuits, **Year 5** have created their own space suit that could be used during a spacewalk on the Moon or a visit to the International Space Station.

This week the **Reception** children have been learning about signs of spring, they have been using their skills to draw portraits of daffodils.



This week in **Year 3** Theme, we started our new topic of the Romans. We learnt about all the different parts of the Roman Soldiers uniform.



On Monday, **Year 4** had a wonderful, interactive day learning about the Anglo Saxons and Vikings. We learnt a lot about the history of England. We acted, played games and examined artefacts from the period. Lots of us dressed up as people from that time too!
