

# School Uniform Policy



## 1. Aims

This policy aims to:

- Set out our approach to requiring a uniform that is of reasonable cost and offers the best value for money for parents and carers
- Explain how we will avoid discrimination in line with our legal duties under the Equality Act 2010
- Clarify our expectations for school uniform

## 2. Our school's legal duties under the Equality Act 2010

The Equality Act 2010 prohibits discrimination against an individual based on the protected characteristics, which include sex, race, religion or belief, and gender reassignment.

To avoid discrimination, our school will:

- Avoid listing uniform items based on sex, to give all pupils the opportunity to wear the uniform they feel most comfortable in or that most reflects their self-identified gender
- Make sure that our uniform costs the same for all pupils
- Allow all pupils to have long hair (though we reserve the right to ask for this to be tied back)
- Allow all pupils to style their hair in the way that is appropriate for school yet makes them feel most comfortable
- Allow pupils to request changes to swimwear for religious reasons
- Allow pupils to wear headscarves and other religious or cultural symbols
- Allow for adaptations to our policy on the grounds of equality by asking pupils or their parents to get in touch with their child's class teacher, who can answer questions about the policy and respond to any requests

## 3. Limiting the cost of school uniform

Our school has a duty to make sure that the uniform we require is affordable, in line with statutory guidance from the Department for Education on the cost of school uniform.

We understand that items with distinctive characteristics (such as branded items, or items that have to have a school logo or a unique fabric/colour/design) cannot be purchased from a wide range of retailers and that requiring many such items limits parents' ability to 'shop around' for a low price.

We will make sure our uniform:

- Is available at a reasonable cost
- Provides the best value for money for parents/carers

We will do this by:

- Carefully considering whether any items with distinctive characteristics are necessary
- Limiting any items with distinctive characteristics where possible
- Limiting items with distinctive characteristics to low-cost or long-lasting items
- Considering cheaper alternatives to school-branded items, such as logos that can be ironed on, as long as this doesn't compromise quality and durability

- Avoiding specific requirements for items pupils could wear on non-school days, such as coats, bags and shoes
- Keeping the number of optional branded items to a minimum, so that the school's uniform can act as a social leveler
- Avoiding different uniform requirements for different year/class/house groups
- Avoiding different uniform requirements for extra-curricular activities
- Considering alternative methods for signaling differences in groups for interschool competitions, such as creating posters or labels
- Making sure that arrangements are in place for parents to acquire second-hand uniform items
- Avoiding frequent changes to uniform specifications and minimising the financial impact on parents of any changes
- Consulting with parents and pupils on any proposed significant changes to the uniform policy and carefully considering any complaints about the policy

## 4. Expectations for school uniform

### 4.1 Our school's uniform

- No branded items of uniform are mandatory; however, most children wear a blue sweatshirt with the school logo and have a logo on their PE hoodie or t-shirt. All branded second-hand uniform items can be bought at an affordable price from our school PTA.
- The school accepts generic uniform clothing items such as plain blue sweatshirts and cardigans which are available at a reasonable cost from high street stores and supermarkets allowing parents the opportunity to shop around for best value.
- Generic items from supermarkets are acceptable for PE uniform items. School logo branded PE hoodie and PE T-shirt can be bought from local suppliers or through our school's PTA used uniform sales.
- We do not allow children to wear items of jewelry due to safety concerns, the exception to this rule are ear-ring studs. If parents have a particular concern regarding this, the headteacher and senior leadership team will work with the parents and children to find a suitable solution.
- We ask that long hair is tied up during PE or certain curriculum activities for health and safety reasons. Extreme hairstyles are not appropriate for school and styling should be kept to a minimum so that children can independently take care of their own hair.
- We do not allow children to wear any type of extended or false finger nails, including any finger nail enhancements, such as acrylics or gel extensions etc.
- Children should wear suitable black footwear. Footwear should have grip on the sole of the shoe to prevent slips and trips. As children spend a lot of time outdoors, children may be requested to bring in old footwear to change into to prevent school shoes getting muddy.
- There are no specific uniform guidelines for bags and coats. When purchasing coats parents may wish to consider visibility, especially if children walk or cycle to school. Many of the school cloakrooms have limited space, so please do not buy over size bags as we do not have the room to accommodate them. For younger children, school logo book bags can be purchased from the schools uniform supplier, or second hand bags from the PTA, but this is not mandatory.

- We ask parents to ensure uniform items are clean, in good repair and all items are clearly labelled with the child's name.

## **5. Expectations for our school community**

### **5.1 Pupils**

Pupils are expected to wear the correct uniform at all times (other than specified non-school uniform days) while:

- On the school premises
- Travelling to and from school
- At out-of-school events or on trips that are organised by the school, or where they are representing the school (if required)

Pupils are also expected to contact the headteacher if they want to request an amendment to the uniform policy in relation to their protected characteristics.

## **5.2 Parents and carers**

Parents are expected to contact the headteacher if they want to request an amendment to the uniform policy in relation to:

- Their child's protected characteristics
- The cost of the uniform

Parents are expected to lodge any complaints or objections relating to the school uniform in a timely and reasonable manner.

Disputes about the cost of the school uniform will be:

- Resolved locally
- Dealt with in accordance with our school's complaints policy

The school will work closely with parents to arrive at a mutually acceptable outcome.

## **5.4 Governors**

The governing board will review this policy and make sure that it:

- Is appropriate for our school's context
- Is implemented fairly across the school
- Takes into account the views of parents and pupils
- Offers a uniform that is appropriate, practical and safe for all pupils
