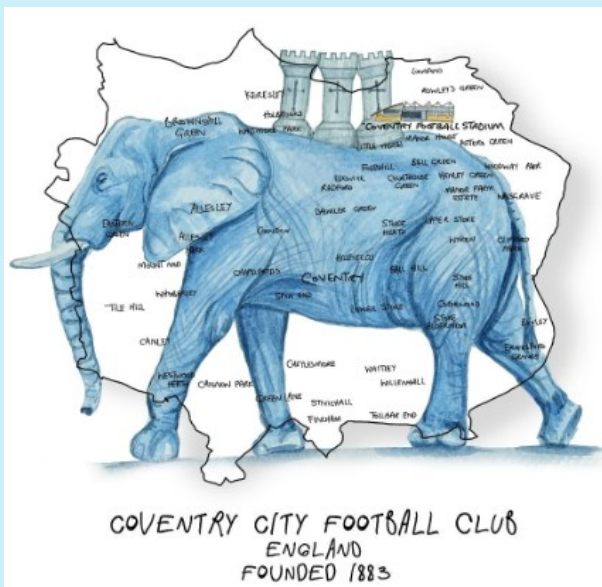

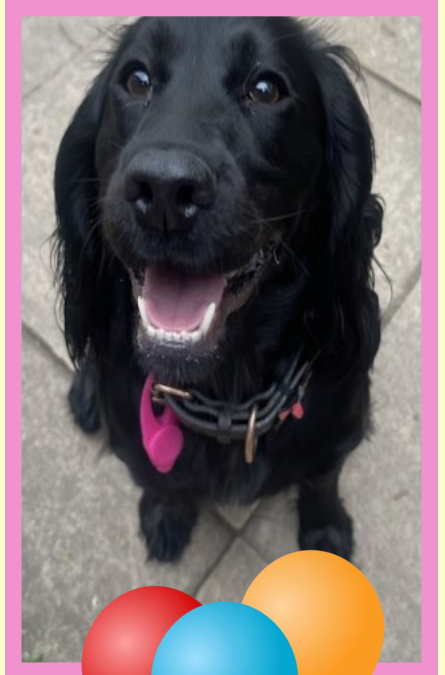

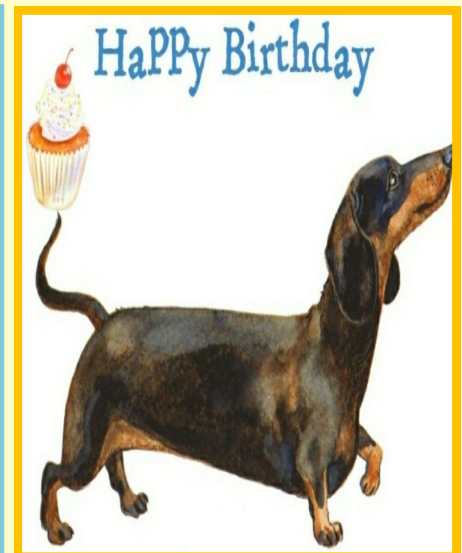

# Celebrating our week



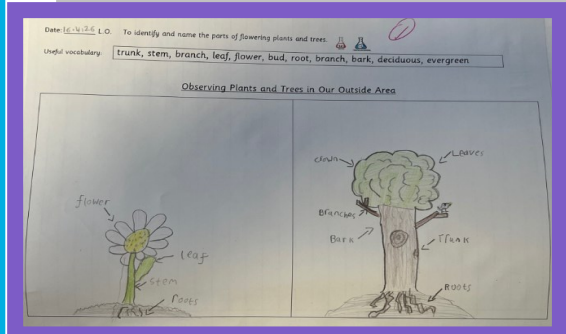
In Nursery we have been learning about frogs and tadpoles. We have read lots of books and sang rhymes, we have played with small world frogs and tadpoles, we have counted them, matched the right amount to numbers, weighed with them and played the frog jumping game.

In Science this week, **Year 5** looked at evidence for the Earth being round. We discovered that in the past some people thought it was flat!

**Year 3** have been having debates this week as to whether they would have liked to have lived during the Roman times or not. We used facts we had found the day before to help us decide.



This week in **Reception** we read the story of Handa's Surprise. We tried all the fruits from the story and discussed which ones we liked and didn't like. We created a bar chart to represent the number of children who liked the fruits. Banana was most popular and avocado was least popular.



This week in **Year 2**, we started our plant topic where we learnt and labelled the parts of a plant.
