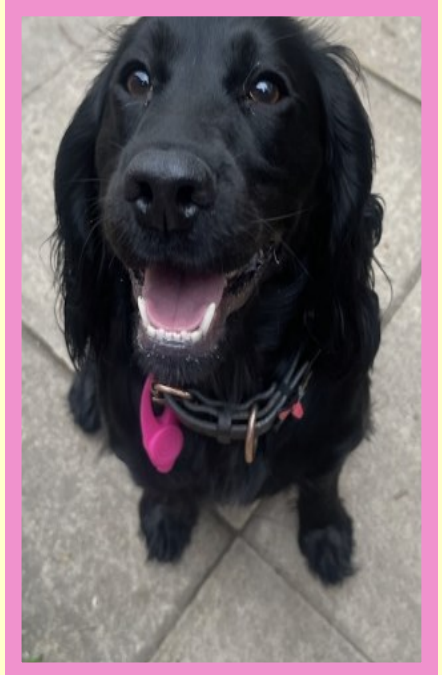

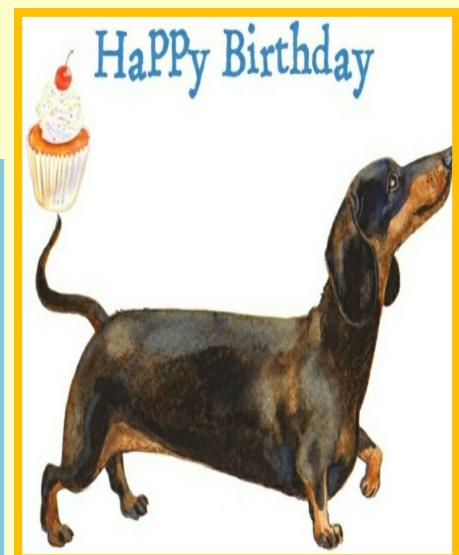

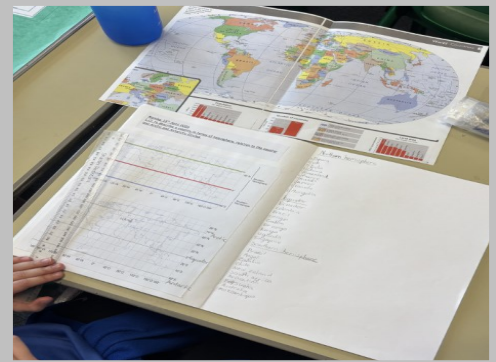
Celebrating our week



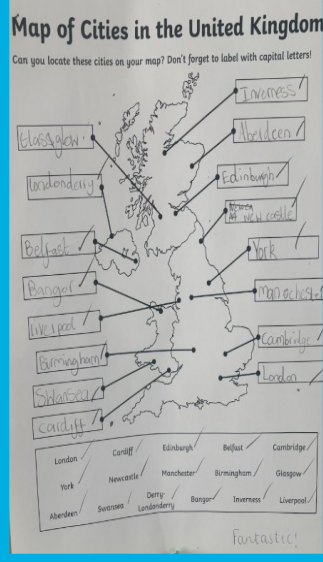
This week, **Year 2** have planted some seeds to test what a plant needs to grow. We are looking forward to seeing if our predictions are correct!

Year 5 enjoyed their music lesson this week. We are learning about blues music which is often emotional, but they don't look very sad do they?

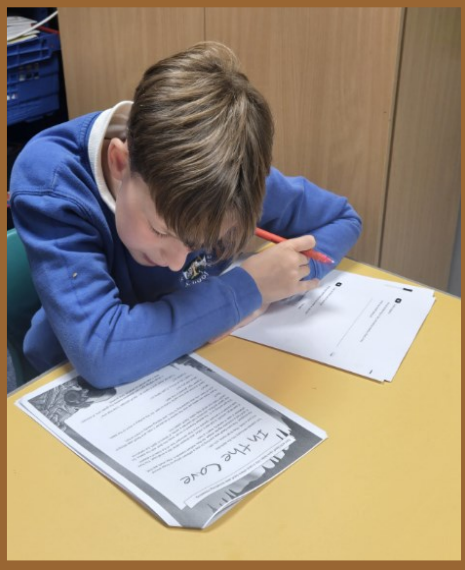
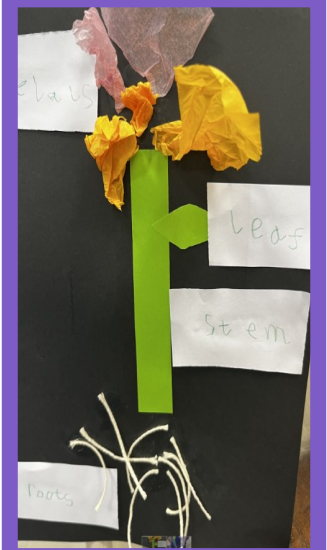
As part of our Volcano topic in theme, **Year 4** were identifying on a map where volcanos could be found around the world.
