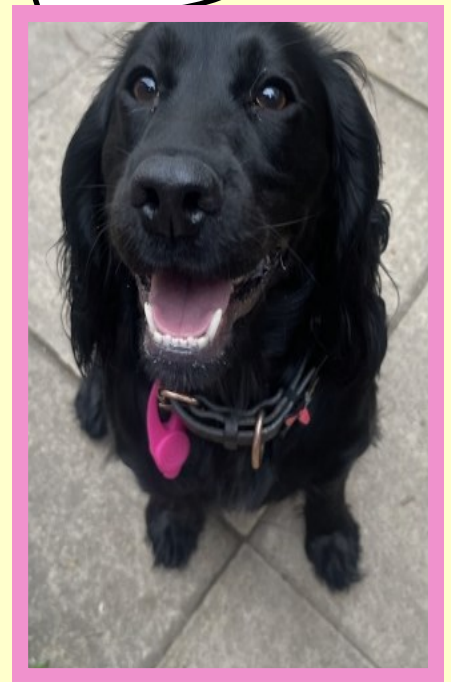

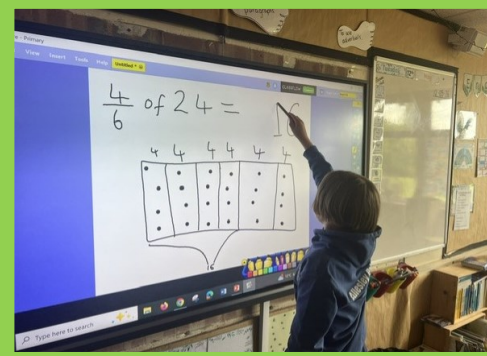

# Celebrating our week

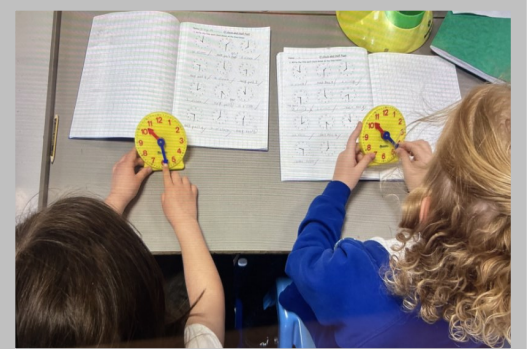


This week in **Reception** we explored the traditional tale Jack and the Beanstalk; We have planted our own beans to see how tall they will grow.

This week in Maths **Year 2** have been learning about time. They have been practising o'clock, half past, quarter past and quarter to.

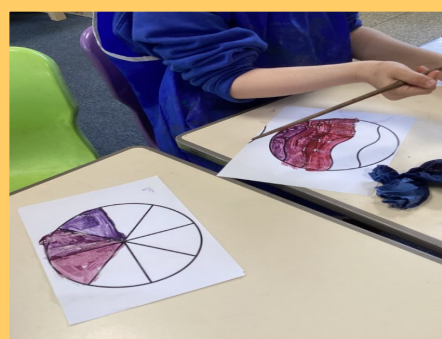


**Year 4** had an enjoyable art lesson, inspired by the sights and sounds of rainforests. They used pastels to capture the images.

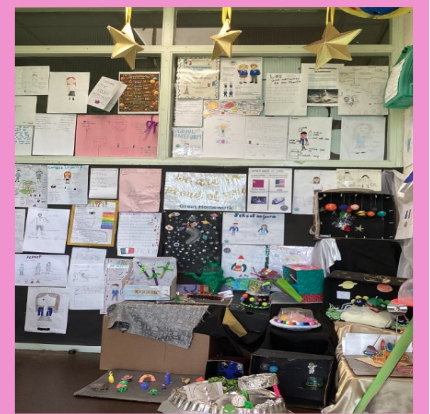
